

WILLIAM WHITLEY HOUSE

RATIO was commissioned to create a preservation plan for the William Whitley House, built in 1794, reportedly the first brick home in Kentucky. Based on the preservation plan, RATIO prepared construction documents for the restoration. The project primarily concentrated on the building's exterior.

The project included an archaeological survey of the area adjacent to the residence, a paint analysis on the exterior wood features, and repairing and repainting of the exterior masonry. Also addressed were drainage problems adjacent to the foundation, the existing roof's wood shingles, masonry chimneys' repair, as well as the repair of the wood windows, doors, and exterior wood trim features. Deteriorated log floor joists were repaired, and access was improved for individuals with disabilities.
